Understanding How We Worship
The Eucharistic Prayer

Last week I wrote about the Offertory, that moment in the Mass when we offer God the bread and wine, which the Holy Spirit will transform into the very body and blood of Christ. Today's column is devoted to the Eucharistic Prayer.

There are four Eucharistic Prayers, and we tend to use different ones on weekdays and Sundays. Although each is different, all of them enjoy a similar structure: Preface, Invocation of the Spirit, Institution Narrative, Memorial of Christ's death and resurrection, Remembrances of the Living and the Dead, Great Doxology, Great Amen.

Every Eucharistic Prayer begins with a **Preface** that praises God for his marvelous deeds of salvation in Jesus Christ. There are more than fifty Prefaces, and we use them at different times during the Church's Liturgical Year. At the end of the Preface, as we are about to enter the most sacred part of the Liturgy, we sing the first of three acclamations, the Sanctus: "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts." The other two proclamations are the Mystery of Faith and the Great Amen.

At the beginning of the Eucharist Prayer, the priest makes an **Invocation of the Spirit**. He prays that the Spirit will come upon the gifts of bread and wine so that they will become the body and blood of Christ for us. In Eucharistic Prayer II, the priest prays: "Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, *by sending down your Spirit upon them like the dewfall*."

Having asked God to send the Spirit upon these gifts, the priest recites the **Institution Narrative** in which he recalls what Christ did at the Last Supper. At this moment the bread and wine are consecrated by the power of the Holy Spirit and become the very body and blood of Christ.

After the consecration, the priest invites the congregation to proclaim the **Mystery of Faith**, and the congregation sings a second acclamation that summarizes the Mystery of Faith: "When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, O Lord, until you come again."

The priest resumes the Eucharistic Prayer with a **Remembrance of Christ's Saving Act**, his death and resurrection. In Eucharistic Prayer II he prays: "Therefore as we celebrate the memorial of his death and resurrection, we offer you, Lord, the bread of life and the chalice of salvation, giving thanks that you have held us worthy to be in your presence and minister to you." There follow a series of prayers in which the priest **remembers the living and the dead**.

After the remembrances of the living and the dead, the priest elevates the consecrated bread and wine and sings **the Great Doxology**: "Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours for ever and ever," to which the congregation responds with the **Great Amen**, which is its third acclamation. This great doxology is the moment when we offer God what he has given to us.

This Eucharistic Prayer is the central moment of the Mass when our gifts become the very body and blood of Christ through the power of God's Spirit. At this moment, we are sacramentally present at the Lord's Supper and at his Death on Calvary.

RCIA

Entrance into the Church: RCIA stands for “The Rite of Christian Initiation.” It is the process by which those who are not Catholic and wish to become Catholic enter the Church. Our RCIA program meets after the 9:30 AM Mass, twice a month, beginning in the fall and early spring, concluding with reception into the church at the Easter Vigil. The program provides a way to learn about the church and experience its community.

The RCIA is for (1) people who were never baptized, (2) non-Catholics who would like to become Catholics, (3) Catholics who were baptized but never catechized and confirmed.
